BEMIDJI, MN - For the first time in school history, Bemidji State University will have play-by-play coverage of soccer, women's hockey, baseball and softball games. Brian and Kelly Schultz, the husband and wife duo that already announces BSU football and hockey on the radio, have started Listen To The Beavers Dot Com. The website will offer streaming audio broadcasts of soccer, women's hockey, baseball and softball. The games are available on a "pay-per-listen" basis for \$5, or a "season ticket" can be purchased for \$100. The season ticket will gain the listener access for ALL games broadcast on LTTB Dot Com. All game broadcasts are also archived, meaning a subscriber with the season ticket can listen to games at their leisure.



BSU Hockey Ready to Begin Season

BSU Looks to Continue Climb - Sets Team WCHA Points Record Last Year

BEMIDJI, MN - The 2006-07 season is one that the Bemidji State women's hockey team will be looking to build on, finishing the season with a 11-20-5 overall record and a 9-15-4 mark in the Western Collegiate Hockey Association (WCHA). The 9-15-4 mark in the WCHA was good enough for a sixth place finish for the second consecutive season. Bemidji State garnered 22 points in WCHA play, which was the most points the Beavers have attained in conference play in its nine year Division I era.

FORWARDS

THE BIGGEST need for the Beavers is offense. The top five scorers from 2006-07 are gone due to graduation; however the Beavers retain good offensive talent and Coach Sertich thinks that 16 returners and seven incoming freshmen will be a catalyst for success. BSU loses its top five leading scorers from a year ago, three of which finished their careers on the top ten list for scoring

in a career at BSU. Kelly Hart finished her career with 100 points, good for second on the career scoring list at BSU.

DEFENSEMEN

THE DEFENSE is also an area that needs to improve from a year ago. Although, BSU improved by nine goals from 2005-06 they still need to improve these statistics. The Beavers let in 110 goals in 2006-07, which amounted to 3.06 goals per game.

GOALTENDING

BEMIDJI STATE returns two solid goaltenders in Emily Brookshaw and Jessica Ptachick from a year ago. Brookshaw has played in 76 career games between the pipes for the Beavers and has proven to be one of the best in the WCHA.

THE BEMIDJI State conference schedule is arguably one of the toughest in the country in 2007-08. For the seventh consecutive

season, the Beavers will go head to head with the defending national champion on four occasions. This season the team opens up regular season and Western Collegiate Hockey Association play by hosting Minnesota State University Oct. 5-6. The Beavers will then hit the road for the remainder of October and the first two weeks of November as they will go on an eight game road swing.

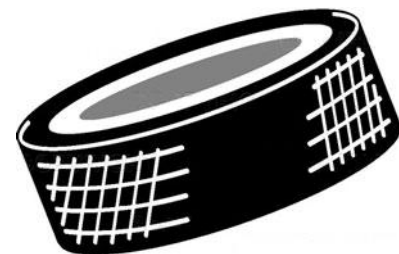
